#### The Leader in Me Program

Prior to the pandemic, Ione Community School was implementing the Leader in Me program for grades K-12. Unfortunately, the program was halted due to the COVID outbreak and in-person school being cancelled. Ione Community School teachers are working to reintroduce the program. The Leader in Me program provides students with the tools to learn to become Leaders by helping them to discover their strengths, learning how change starts with them, and how to track their progress and hold themselves accountable. The Leader in Me

program is based on the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People by Steven R. Covey. For October teachers focused on Habit 1, *Be Proactive*! At the end of the month, one student from each the elementary and secondary grade levels will be chosen for student of the month based on the habit, *Being Proactive*. Here are some examples of what we are looking for when Being Proactive: Developing responsibility for their actions, emotions, attitudes, choices, and behaviors. Understanding and applying the concept "Choose Your Own Weather" (choose your feelings, and responses.) Focus thinking and behaviors on things they can control vs. things they can't control.

**FOR GRADUATNG SENIORS: FAFSA** opened October 1st, 2021. #### Mrs. Orem's 4th Grade

The 4<sup>th</sup> grade is participating in Oregon Agriculture in the Classroom literacy subscription box for the 2021-22 school year. Each month the 4<sup>th</sup> graders receive a box from the Oregon

Ag in the Classroom that contains a book and activity that revolves around agriculture in Oregon. In September, students took a quiz about everyday objects and their source they came from. Mrs. Orem read Where Did My

<u>Clothes Come From?</u> by Chris Butterworth, and students found through their investigations that all the objects were from agriculture and our earth. In October, the students read <u>The Apple Orchard Riddle</u>, by Margaret McNamara and G. Brian Karas. Students learned about apples and the process of grafting. Students used paper straws to practice the whip & tongue grating process. Don Walker from the STEM program at the SAGE Center visited the classroom twice in October. During his first visit, students learned about the meaning of STEM and straw rockets. On his second visit students learned about sphero robots and how to move them.

**Mrs. Ogden's 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Grades:** The 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders finished a novel study of Esperanza Rising, the story of a Mexican immigrant during the Great Depression. To further their understanding of Mexican culture, they learned about artist Frida Kahlo. The class got a kick out creating portraits of Frida with a pronounced unibrow! In math, the 5<sup>th</sup> graders have been working on multi-digit long division with remainders. The 6<sup>th</sup> graders have been learning about fractions, greatest common factors, and least common multiples.



#### "Dead Word Cemetery"

This month, the 8th Grade students created a "Dead Word Cemetery" in their language arts class. This activity is designed to help students use stronger synonyms for words while weak words are "laid to rest."
